



## Shepherd's Corner

Dear parishioners,

Twelve months ago, things looked dire. I said this: "The history of the Spanish Influenza of 1918 gives an important context within which to view the current crisis. Are we exaggerating the danger of this virus? No, ... It is not an exaggeration to say that society could collapse if we do not take this seriously enough. The only way to avoid 1/3 of all Canadians sick in 6-8 weeks time is to be very careful now." Those were days of innocence and freedom!

Now we know that this novel corona virus is treatable. Many doctors have treated the virus with fantastically positive results, but their voices are marginalised or silenced. Why? If we follow the money, we realize the big banks, big governments, big pharma, big media, and big multinationals are working together to create a new paradise for themselves. Unfortunately, this means a hell for you and me.

Rational discussion is going the way of the dodo bird. Do we submit our ideas to the truth or submit the truth to our ideas? We are blind, sometimes, to our own dishonesty. One important sign is this: do we give a full hearing to those with whom we disagree? Humility and an honest pursuit of the truth dictate that we do. We see two methods: 1) Analyse all the evidence, both pro and con, and then make a careful, moderate, judgement, or 2) state an opinion boldly, give supporting evidence only, ignore all evidence to the contrary, then, disparage anyone who disagrees. Which one sounds like a search for the truth?

Journalism and what passes as 'science' have fallen to habitual dishonesty. Opinion is the truth just because. All dissenters must be silenced because they dissent; no other justification is necessary. The silence is definitely imposed in various ways to make tyranny look civil. It is not. Those who regularly consume the products of the mass media are blinded by this dishonesty. While they might be angry at such a suggestion, they will be incapable of a rational discussion of such. Ideas have been imposed on them by relentless, unopposed repetition. They know what they believe, and strongly, but they just cannot say why.

Who is going to save us from ourselves, pitiable creatures that we are? Would that we all wanted to be saved.

Jesus Christ alone can save us from ourselves. He has come to do so, by means of His Holy Mother, the Co-Redemptrix.
